[A jobs crisis in the cultural and creative industries](#)

A report which explores the impact of the pandemic on the cultural and creative sector. Findings include, in the six months following the beginning of lockdown, the sector has seen:

- A collapse in working hours across the creative industries
- 55,000 job losses (a 30% decline) in music, performing and visual arts
- Significantly higher than average numbers of people leaving creative occupations compared to previous years.

[Destination data](#)

This is the destination data for leavers from Key Stage 4 and those completing their 16-18 study in 2017/18 and where they went in 2018/19.

- For Key stage 4 - 94% of pupils were in a sustained education, apprenticeship or employment destination, unchanged from the previous year
- 91% of pupils leaving state funded mainstream schools in London went onto a sustained education destination the following year the highest across all regions. This compares to North East which has the lowest at 83%. London had the lowest rates going to apprenticeship (1%) and employment (2%) destinations.

[£25million investment in training to support London's economic recovery](#)

Sadiq Khan has announced £25 million of funding to support London's economic recovery. £10m of the funding will support skills training for sectors which are vital to London's recovery. These sectors have been named as digital, health, social care, the environment, and creative and cultural industries. The remaining funds will support essential skills development including numeracy and literacy.
