





This was the Annual Extended Mace debating competition hosted by the US Embassy. Heats took place at Benjamin Franklin House and the finalists were then invited to the US Embassy for the final. The morning was taken up by debating 2 heats. Sebha Bhasra and Batool Malik from Y12 started off debating about whether the emergency services should have the right to strike, then debating, This House believes that the global tourism industry does more harm than good.

They then took on the Southbank International School in the semi finals debating, This house believes that economic sanctions do not defend against threats to international peace and security.

Unbelievably, they won all four debates!

They then made tracks to the US Embassy where they went head to head with Camden School for Girls. They performed brilliantly and won the final which is an amazing achievement. Sehba won runner up best speaker in the competition and Batool the overall winner.

Batool will now head to the US in June where she will spend 4 weeks in Indiana. The individual prize for the Year 12 & 13 category is a place at the prestigious Benjamin Franklin Transatlantic Fellows Summer Institute. This is a 4 week programme from late June to late July at Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana. Awesome!

The group have been hosting regular planning meetings after school on how to better inform their school community of the issues as well as raise funds for the charity.

Yesterday the group met with the ČEO of CRY Steve Cox and he remarked how impressed he was by their level of maturity and commitment. He took on board the points they raised, and will be sharing the organizations research findings and information regarding the roles of: Coroner, Pathologist, Cardiologist & Geneticists within the work they do.

He is going to think about a possible webinar with one of their cardiologists, and a possible link with The My Heart counselling group that provide support for bereaved families.
