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Senior Borough Athletics



On Wednesday 11th May the Y9 and Y10 Athletics team attended their first Senior Borough Athletics Championship at Hillingdon track. The morning was off to a fantastic start with Yussra Bendiabdullah securing 5th in the 800m opening race, shortly followed Malaika De Alwis running for the Y10 girls who took the bronze medal. The track team continued to win medal after medal with Asmaa Abdirahman taking gold in the Y10 1500m and Natalia Ramdomska taking silver for the Y9s in just 5:55s! With the track team off to an incredible start the field team were excited for their chance to compete. Despite the rain, both Christiana Wema-Reeves and Teya Cummings secured personal bests and took the gold medals for High Jump and Triple Jump respectively.

Another incredible performance came from Honour Kolombo taking the silver in the Y9 Discus and Amy Scott taking the Bronze in the Y10 Shot Put.

The day came to a close with the final track events. Having secured her place in the 100m final, Ibukan took and held an early lead to cross the finish line in just 13:51 seconds! The final event of the day was the 4x100m relay. Both Y9 and Y10 teams had secured their place in the final having qualified in the heats. The Y9s ran the first race with Christiana, Caitlin, Natalia and Ibukan. The girls ran incredibly crossing the finish line with a lead of just 0.27s. Another gold medal for Swakleys! The Y10's then nervously took their place for the relay with Anesha, Andreina, Maleekah and Teya all running for Swakleys. Going into the final bend Swakeleys sat in the middle of the pack. Teya ran an incredible final leg to secure silver for the Y10 relay team. The day came to a close with 16 medals secured! Despite all the sporting excellence on the day, the real success came from seeing the incredible sportsmanship and encouragement the girls gave one another. **Overall results saw Y9 taking 3rd place and Y10 2nd place. Well done all!**




DIGITAL FOOTPRINTS

ROBOTICS COMPETITION

Since October 2021, we have been working tremendously hard to build, code and create a robot to compete in this year's Student Robotics Competition 2022, 'This Way Up', held at Southampton University on Saturday 23rd and Sunday 24th of April. The competition's aim was to create a robot that could pick up cans and take them back into our scoring zones, some cans were upside down (worth 1pt) and others were the right way up (worth 2pts) but were much harder to get. It took us many months: at lunch, after school and even on Saturdays (yes we went to school on Saturday), to get the robot to work but we had finally made it!



Once we got there, we had the opportunity to see many different types of robots, some made of cardboard, some made of wood (like ours) and others that took the shape of a time machine from Doctor Who!! Though we didn't have a prominent theme, we did have a lot of fun!

As soon as we got to our team pit, we started finalising code and perfecting more minor details, and before we knew it, we were in the arena for our first match. Our first match wasn't the best match, mostly because we didn't move - but it was a great experience, watching how the battle to get the cans unfolded. Going into the second, third, fourth and finally our tenth match of the day, we had not scored a single can, except for one: during the ninth match where we had finally taken one can home! For a first time competitor, it was a tremendous achievement!

On the second day, we came back with more ideas, we changed and tested, repeatedly for hours until the last few matches that our robot would ever compete in. We mostly came 2nd place in league matches, and 3rd in some and even 1st! Soon, the qualifier rounds came and we had successfully managed to get 2 cans in the first match, so we advanced into the quarter-finals. Unfortunately, we had come third in that match and did not advance to the semi-finals, despite this, we had sat there, watched and cheered the other teams on as they competed in the final matches.

The highlights for both days for us were getting our first can into our scoring zone, stealing another team's can and getting two cans in our scoring zone!! Overall, the competition was a great experience that we would all recommend to anyone who is interested in STEM. It really helped us explore our abilities and helped us realise that anything is achievable; and hopefully, we will get the chance to go to this competition again next year!
