[BFI and ERIC screen careers research](#)

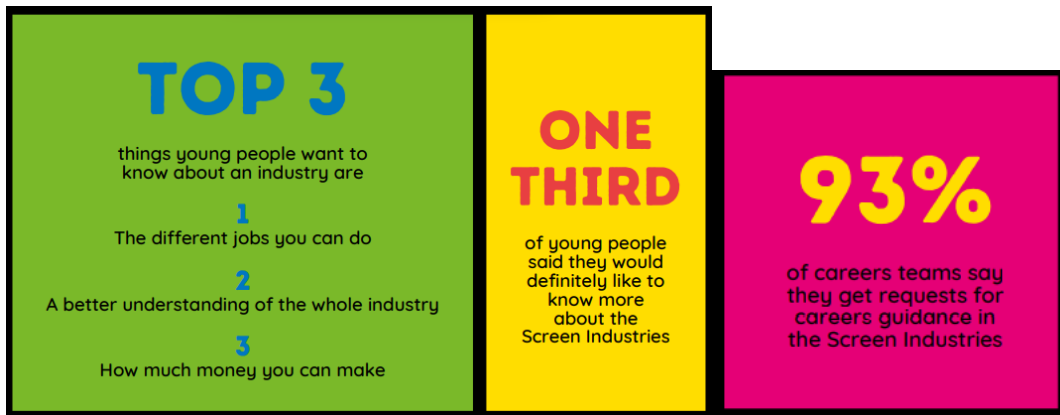
Following research that 13 to 16 year olds are not receiving adequate careers advice about the screen industries, the BFI and ERIC produced a report outlining recommendations to address the knowledge gap. The report also looks at careers advice in schools and in relation to screen industries.

Some findings include:

- There is a shortage of skilled crew in film, TV, VFX, animation and games
- 82% of employers rated recruitment difficulties as moderate to very serious
- Young people and careers teams want to know more about careers in the screen industries and they need to be better supported by the industry
- More young people are looking for careers information through social media platforms such as TikTok and YouTube. This poses a great opportunity for the industry to provide short-form careers guidance on these platforms.

The CITB has released its regional 5-year outlooks. Key points for London include:

- An extra 26,000 construction workers will be needed from 2022 to 2026
- Occupations in demand include non-construction professional, technical, IT and other office-based staff; construction process managers and wood trades and interior fit-out
- A number of very large scale/long term developments such as Thamesmead, Brent Cross Town, Old Oak Park and Castle Green. These will deliver output for a number of sectors.

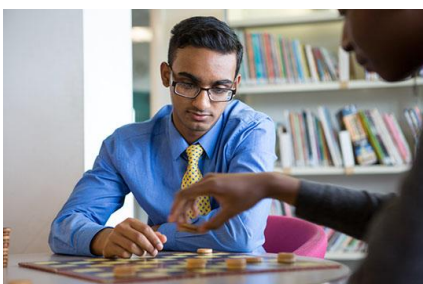
Five new biotech businesses are coming to the White City Innovation District and are set to create new jobs for local residents.
