### End of Term arrangements: Non-Uniform Day

As the spring term draws to a close we would like to thank all parents and carers for their ongoing support. Please read our newsletter which is full of updates about the life of the school community.

On Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023 students will finish school after Period 3. Year 7 will be dismissed at 12.15 and Years 8-11 at 12.25. Please remind your child to empty their locker and bring any PE kit home to be washed.

There will be a collection at the door in aid of period poverty with a suggested donation of £1.

Clothing worn as 'non-uniform' must be suitable for school and we are confident that you will support us by checking the outfit that your child chooses to wear. Some guidelines are listed below to support us all.

- Low heeled shoes or trainers are acceptable but stiletto heels are not.
- Jewellery is permitted but please avoid large earrings which are a health and safety issue.
- Tops and dresses must cover the midriff.
- Hats and caps are not allowed in the school building.
- A modest amount of make-up is permitted in all year groups.
- Clothing must not have inappropriate slogans.
- Nail varnish is allowed for this day only. False nails are not allowed.

Final decisions about the suitability clothing will be made by the Pastoral Team. Pupils who come dressed in an inappropriate way will be placed in alternative provision if arrangements cannot be made for them to change.

The first day of the summer term for students is Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> April 2023 and school starts at the normal time of 8.40am.
