Performing Arts

The Performing Arts Department is a lively and friendly team of specialist teachers. We are an outstanding department, consisting of skilled practitioners who contribute not only to the teaching and learning within Performing Arts, but also more widely throughout the school by our thriving extracurricular programme. We currently showcase drama, dance and music in the following events – Shakespeare Schools Festival, Winter Showcase, Celebration Evening, Music Evening, Dance Evening, Annual Musical and Summer Festival. These are popular events. Over 150 girls took part in the Winter Showcase and 90 took place in our latest production of "Matilda."

We work together on long-term policies and have a well-developed bank of shared resources. We also develop a love and an enjoyment of the Performing Arts subjects.
