

Year 12 Brilliant Club Graduation Monday 26th February 2024

On Monday 26th February, twelve of our year 12 pupils were invited to attend their graduation from the Brilliant Club Scholars Programme. The day began with a tour of Brasenose College, University of Oxford, with current students. They attended information, advice and guidance sessions, and celebrated their achievements at a graduation ceremony at Oxford Town Hall. This was all to mark the successful completion of their Brilliant Club project, having achieved an impressive set of results, including two First Class and eight 2:1 grades. Since October their tutor Ushemegbe Rita Ekhareafo, a PhD researcher from UCL, has delivered an in-school tutorial programme of university-style tutorials. This has been based on the research area she is studying, in the Environmental Assessment of Chemical Contamination from Abandoned Coal and Mineral Mines. After all the tutorials were over, students had to complete a final assignment, which was a 2000 word essay using all the knowledge and research skills gained on the programme. The essay was marked to university standard and with the university grading system (First Class, 2:1 etc.) and detailed feedback was given on their work.

The following girls took part in the programme: Ruby 12I, Aamnah 12O, Ashuvinie 12@, Preena 12I, Samia 12T, Neemah 12S, Anna 12S, Prabjot 12X, Zainab 12R, Kashifa 12@, Tyia 12I, and Manpreet 12M.

"The Brilliant club was an enlightening experience, allowing me to develop my essay writing skills and knowledge on life at university. Our sessions with our tutor gave me a realistic insight into the structure of universities and how it can differ from lower school years. Our trip to Brasenose college was a really nice way to celebrate our achievements and be proud of what we managed to complete. We were able to learn about the university and specific colleges, but also hear from students, who were able to explain their experiences. Overall, the whole experience was really well put together and informative."


We will be introducing a student survey next term to gain an idea of the dishes and flavours our students enjoy. The feedback will be used to consider ideas when developing our Autumn menu.

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Year 7 'Game of 24 Maths Challenge'

On the 13th of March we had 4 year 7 students attend the Game of 24 Challenge at Ruislip High School. Students worked in teams of 2 to compete against schools from around the borough, with over 20 teams competing against each other on the day. The aim of the competition is to use the four operations (add, subtract, multiply and divide) and the four numbers provided to create the number 24. The competition consisted of three different phases and the final phase included using fractions and decimals. The '24 game' encourages rapid mathematical thinking in high pressure situations. The students showed excellent skills in mathematics and demonstrated communication and cooperation skills whilst working within pairs to solve each problem.



The girls should be commended for their excellent progress in the competition, and for showing great enthusiasm throughout the day.

Swakeleys School for Girls Receives National Recognition for Performance

Swakeleys School for Girls are delighted that their excellent outcomes have been recognised by SSAT (Specialist Schools and Academies Trust) in this year's Educational Outcomes Awards. The award recognises that Swakeleys School for Girls is among the highest performing secondary schools in the country, based on 2023 performance data and information from Ofsted.

Swakeleys School for Girls was recognised in two categories, receiving awards for being in the top 20% of schools nationally for student progress and in the top 20% of non-selective schools for student attainment in the 2023 end of KS4 exams.

The SSAT Educational Outcomes database compares all state-funded schools in England. To be recognised with an Educational Outcomes Award is a significant achievement and a testament to the work of the whole school community.
