Where can your child study?

Places you can learn			Things to consider	
School 6th Form	Year 12 to 13 (Year 14 in some schools).	Learning and timetabling is more flexible than Year 7 to 11, but you will be expected to study independently during your free periods.	You can usually wear your own clothes, but there may be specific instructions, such as business wear only.	
6th Form College	6th Form College for 16 to 19-year-olds.	College campuses are often larger than school sites.	Learning and timetabling are more flexible than in school, but you will be expected to study independently during your free periods.	
Further Education (FE) College	For people aged 16+.	College campuses are often considerably larger than school sites. A larger campus means more people.	Learning and timetabling are more flexible than in school, but you will be expected to study independently during your free periods.	
Independent Special Schools and Colleges More information →	For 16 to 25-year- olds with additional learning and physical needs.	Learning is based on your needs and may require you to go to a school out of the borough.	You can wear your own clothes.	
Apprenticeship providers / Training centres	For people aged 16+.	Learning and timetabling are more flexible and there is a real focus on getting you ready for the world of work.	You can wear your own clothes.

An opportunity for pupils in Year 10 to shadow a parent / guardian or close family friend so that they can get a real-life insight in to the world of work.






