

Clifton Garden/Snowden Avenue Junction Improvements planned for February half term

We have been liaising with Hillingdon council to discuss any improvements that they can make to the Clifton Gardens/Snowdon Junction areas of the school. We recently had confirmation that they have passed plans to improve the visibility and prominence of the crossings at this junction, which will, we hope, make it safer for pedestrians and make it easier for drivers to see the junction end as they approach, so that they can slow down and drive safely. We understand the council are planning to carry out these works over the February half term 2025. We will still continue to encourage road safety for everyone and welcome more parents to arrange to collect their daughters from a nearby

pick-up point, a short walk from the school. If you need to collect directly from the school, please be considerate when parking and dropping off. Thank you for your co-operation.
